Suggestions for improvement:	 Work on not popping up on pitches in dirt - wider stance will help keep feet planted Set up closer to catcher – too much space between PU and catcher – nice job of adjusting between women's league game and provincials Check the rules on the new charged defensive delay for U19 and higher When faced with a challenging rules situation, take a few second to compose self by going to the scorekeeper and regrouping Hits to OF – BU needs to beat the BR inside so you can stay ahead of the play
